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

A 6,123-square-foot home on Sawgrass Cove in Conway was the most expensive home sold in Faulkner County in September. The 4-bed, 4-bath home was sold for \$860,000 and \$140.45 per square foot. The home, built in 2000 on a three-quarter-acre lot, was on the market for 43 days.

The top five homes averaged a sale price of \$760,800 and \$199.26 per square foot. Comparatively, the median home in Conway was \$276,000 and \$153.35 per square foot, while the median home in Faulkner County was \$259,000 and \$151.22 per square foot.

Three of the top five homes were sold in Conway. All three homes sold for \$825,000 or more. The remaining homes were sold in Greenbrier and Mayflower. The average lot size was 1.43 acres.

The number of homes sold in Faulkner County through September is up 35 homes from 1,160 in 2023. The number of homes sold in Conway through the same period is down 66 homes to 487.

Home sales are up \$36.7 million in Faulkner County from \$321.6 million in 2023, while home sales are up \$9.9 million in Conway to \$156.6 million in 2024.

The median home price in Conway is up \$36,000 from \$240,000, while the median home price in Faulkner County is up \$19,000 from \$240,000. The median home price in the U.S. is \$412,300, according to the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis. The median home price in the South is \$371,600.

Harps Foods is adding a location at the corner of Dave Ward Drive and Country Club Road.

It is set to open in spring 2025, according to company officials. The location will feature a fuel center. This will be the second Conway location with another at 1120 E. German Lane in east Conway.

The \$5.09 million, 39,471-square-foot project is being completed by Commerce Construction Company, of Springdale.

Harps Foods was founded in the 1930s in Springdale and has grown to be the largest employee-owned company headquartered in Arkansas. The regional chain has more than 150 locations in Arkansas, Oklahoma, Missouri, Kansas, Mississippi, and Louisiana. 9
